We were joined by Fr. Nicholas Stebbing CR on Sunday 22nd October, who told us of the work of TARIRO in Zimbabwe.

Fr. Stebbing was born in Zimbabwe and served as a priest there before joining the Community of the Resurrection at Mirfield. In spite of this he not lost contact with the land of his birth.

For many people in Zimbabwe life is beyond difficult; the young in particular have little hope. Tariro in Shona, the main language of Zimbabwe, means Hope. And it is the Church in that land that is working
